Travel info:

People should arrive on Wednesday 21st at Trondheim airport Værnes, located 40 km outside Trondheim city centre. There will be a gathering to meet and greet on the Wednesday evening.

To get to the city centre take the airport buss going to Trondheim S, leaving every 15 minutes until 21.35 or get on the local train going from Værnes to Trondheim S, last train leaves at 22.54 (http://www.nsb.no/?lang=en_US). A third option is taxi, but if by far more expensive.

Book a one night stay in Trondheim. Go to Hotels.com and type in Trondheim, Norway. Then go to Landmarks, tick of City Centre and adjust the search to within 2-5 miles. We recommend City Living Schøller, and for a cheaper option; the Jarlen pension (http://www.jarlen.no/en/home) located nearby. A bus will drive us to Sletvik field station the next day and back to the airport on the day of departure.
